February 21, 2012

The Board of Mayes County Commissioners met in a regularly scheduled meeting with all members present: Ryan Ball, Chairman, Alva Martin and Darrell Yoder, Members, and Rita Littlefield, County Clerk. The initial notice of the meeting was received in writing December 15, 2011, and the agenda for this meeting was posted on the lower floor of the Court House at 4:30 p.m., February 16, 2012. Chairman Ryan Ball called the meeting to order in compliance with the Open Meeting Law and the following business was done:

Motion made by Commissioner Ball, seconded by Commissioner Yoder, to approve the minutes of regular meeting of February 13, 2012. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.

Motion made by Commissioner Ball, seconded by Commissioner Martin, to award bids for the Local IT/Phone Vendor. The low bid for an I.T. vendor was awarded to Ages Computers for a rate of \$69.00 per hour for out of shop labor. The second low bid for a phone maintenance agreement was awarded to Dee's Communication for a rate of \$70.00 per hour. Ages Computers had included Dee's Communications on their bid for telephone service at their \$69.00 per hour rate, but due to the possible need for service at times when Ages Computer would not be available, this part of the bid was awarded directly to Dee's Communication at a different rate. Commissioners wish to allow use of Rush Communications as back-up. Commissioner Martin requested that there be a log kept showing who has been in and out of the media room. Commissioner Ball requested that the invoices explain what service was performed and be itemized for charges. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.

Motion made by Commissioner Yoder, seconded by Commissioner Martin, to certify results of Fair Board Election held February 11, 2012, at the District #2 barn in Chouteau at which time Larry Ramsey was elected to serve. The following Fair Board members were unopposed: District #1 – Kelly Brown and District #3 – Christopher Scott Reed. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.

Motion made by Commissioner Martin, seconded by Commissioner Ball, to approve a Resolution naming the following projects as priority to be added to the HB1176 2017 program year: District #1 – True Road (SH20 to SH28); District #2 – Old Hwy 33 from N425 to Hwy 69; District #3 – Jerco Road – S442 between Hwy 82 and E640. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.

Motion made by Commissioner Ball, seconded by Commissioner Martin, to approve a Transfer in T County Highway. \$23,824.00 will be transferred from the Maintenance & Operation Account, T-2A and \$2,500.00 will be put in Travel, T-1B, \$5,000.00 will be put in Lease Payments, T-2B, and \$16,324.00 will be put in Capital Outlay, T-3. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.

Motion made by Commissioner Martin, seconded by Commissioner Ball, to approve Resolution to deposit \$453.41 to T County Highway, District #1. \$101.15 was received from Adair Public Schools for reimbursement for dirt hauling expense, \$157.73 was received from Emergency Management for fuel reimbursement, and \$194.53 was received from Firefighters Revolving Fund for fuel reimbursement. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.

Johnny Janzen, Emergency Management Director, advised the Board that Mayes County had been chosen as a pilot program for a campaign regarding "Turn Around Don't Drown". The County has been awarded a Federal Grant in the amount of \$15,000.00 from Oklahoma Emergency Management, through FEMA. These funds are to be used to purchase signs stating "Turn Around Don't Drown" to be placed in low water areas where flooding occurs, and once the signs are in place Johnny will make a map of their locations. It was estimated that we could purchase approximately 100 signs. City of Pryor already has several signs, but still needs a few more, and the Town of Salina needs some within their city limits. Johnny advised the Board that they need to determine where these signs need to be placed throughout the County.

Commissioner Ball reported Chimney Rock Road off of Hwy 82 up to the Pumpback, east of Salina, will be closing this week to begin repairs. The Road will only be open to local traffic for approximately 6 months.

Motion made by Commissioner Martin, seconded by Commissioner Ball to approve a Utility Permit for Ray Gilpin to install a 1" waterline between Sections 7 T23N R20E and Sections 12 T23N R19E. Ball, Yes; Martin, Yes; Yoder, Yes.
