## October 1, 2018

The Board of Mayes County Commissioners met in a regularly scheduled meeting with all members present: Ryan Ball, Chairman and Kevin Whiteside & Meredith Frailey, Members, Brittany True-Howard, County Clerk. The initial notice of the meeting was received in writing December 15, 2017, and the agenda for this meeting was posted on the lower floor of the Court House at 4:30 p.m., September 27, 2018. Ryan Ball called the meeting to order in compliance with the Open Meeting Law and the following business was done:

Commissioner Ball led the Pledge of Allegiance. Commissioner Frailey led the Invocation.

The following individuals spoke on agenda item #13: Lori Bissonnette let the Board know that all of Brandon's Pleasant View covenants require all changes to be put in writing and they were never notified, verbally or otherwise that it was the intention of the majority to give right of way to Mayes County. She believes the agreement is null and void. She believes there is no benefit to the Counties General Public since it does not connect any other roads or serve school children; John Bissonnette presented a Resolution acknowledging receipt that he will be sending to Gary Jones, State Auditor, Mike Hunter Attorney General and Tom Gann, State Representative. The Resolution is asking for Mayes County to immediately cease all work on Private road 440.2 and that Mayes County. State Auditor and State Attorney General immediately investigate the Mayes County Commissioner for District 2 for unlawful acts of said agreement and for the return of all tax payer funds expended so far; Coya Bolinger, doesn't feel it is right to spend thousands of Mayes County Tax Payers dollars on 520 road where there are no homes, no families, and no school age children needing to catch the school bus. She drives this road daily and believes it would be to their advantage but doesn't believe it would be in the best interest of District 2 residents. She would like to know when the road went from a private road to a county road.
